Context

The agreement outlines the partnership of Basingstoke Canal Canoe Club (BCCC) and KC21 Kayak.

Objectives

To promote community-focused participation of young people in paddlesport.

To support the KC21 Kayak project as an associate member of the club, offering club facilities and appropriate opportunities for further development and participation.

To share appropriate resources to support both BCCC and KC21 Kayak activities.

KC21Kayak

KC21 Kayak is part of KC21, a registered charity (no. 1107682) and is supported by the BCU Young People's Programme. Staffed by qualified coaches, KC21 Kayak aims to provide disadvantaged young people with a personal development opportunity which can lead to national accreditation. For some, it represents an adventure training opportunity they may never otherwise be able to realise.

Core principles

All activities will be:

- Conducted within the framework of KC21's recognised child protection policy and guidelines.
- Run in accordance with **British Canoe Union** governing body guidelines, particularly relating to coaching and officiating qualifications and safe practices.
- operate in accordance with:
 - Basingstoke Canal Canoe Club code(s) of conduct (to be agreed)
 - **British Canoe Union** governing body best practice particularly relating to behaviour, clothing, warming-up and cooling-down, safe use of appropriate equipment, preparation and planning and the provision of positive feedback.

In the interests of equity, all activities will be accessible to all young people in the partnership and appropriate to their abilities. No charge will be made by KC21 Kayak for participants, although organisations who partake in KC21 Kayak activities may ask for donations from participants to cover their costs.

KC21Kayak commitment

- KC21 Kayak will designate a member of the KC21 Kayak project as liaison officer for the partnership agreement.
- KC21 Kayak will carry appropriate insurance for public liability and for equipment.
- KC21 Kayak will secure equipment stored in the boathouse, where it is not for shared use.

BCCC commitment


- BCCC will appoint a named coach or official as the liaison officer with KC21 Kayak.
- BCCC will provide storage space for KC21 Kayak boats (10 Master TGs), paddles (13 TNP), buoyancy aids (10 YAK Kallista) & helmets (10 AP4000), in exchange for:
 - Boat storage fees at the standard BCCC rate.
 - BCCC use of the KC21 Kayak boats and paddles (only) on flat water with no charge to be made for wear and tear, but help provided in making repairs.
 - Note – KC21 Kayak use of these boats takes precedence, which is planned for weekends.
- BCCC will provide KC21 Kayak with affiliated membership of the club in exchange for the current appropriate affiliate subscription fee. Affiliate membership entitles KC21 Kayak coaches to participation in BCCC coaching activities and courses and club activities and permits the use of BCCC club boats (with precedence to BCCC activities or events).

Sharing of equipment

Any sharing of equipment outside of the commitments above will be subject to case-by-case agreement.

Review

The relationship and this agreement will be reviewed on an annual basis through a meeting of the designated liaison officers May of each year. The agreement will be renewable from the 1st May each year.
